Ninette Beaver former KMTV reporter best known for her biography and NBC documentary about Caril Fugate, the convicted companion of mass murderer Charles Starkweather.

John Gottschalk chairman, Omaha World-Herald Co. After the third-generation newspaperman joined the World-Herald in 1975, the World-Herald expanded from a single enterprise to include 28 newspapers, a national major-market direct mail company and other non-newspaper holdings.

Gary Kerr dean of television newscasters. When he left WOWT in 1998, the local icon was Omaha's longest-tenured TV newscaster. He has received OPC's Career Achievement and UNO's Lifetime Achievement awards among others.

The Rev. Lee Lubbers, S.J. founder and first president of SCOLA (Satellite Communications for Learning), which retransmits via satellite and the Internet television news and entertainment broadcasts from more than 80 countries in 70 languages. (posthumous)
