#### **Location:**

The club is located on the 22<sup>nd</sup> floor of the First National Bank Center, 1620 Dodge St. It is adjacent to the Doubletree Hotel.

#### **Parking:**

Parking is available in the DoubleTree Hotel garage, which is located east of the main hotel entrance. Bring your parking ticket to the club for free validation. OPC will provide two hours of free parking at lunchtime and dinnertime.

If coming from the DoubleTree garage, take the parking garage elevator to the ground level. Follow the OPC posted direction signs on the corridor leading to the First National Bank Center. You will go past a gift shop/fast food facility. Continue walking west to the main elevators. You are on the first floor of the building.

If coming from the Central City Garage, take the parking garage elevator to the ground level. Proceed east on the corridor leading to the First National Bank Center. You will come out of the corridor on the first level of the First National Bank Center at the main elevators.

Only two elevators go to the 22<sup>nd</sup> floor. They are located on the south side of the elevator lobby. If you take any of the other elevators, get off on the 21<sup>st</sup> floor and take the spiral staircase one flight up to the club.
